
Mr. Phil Celebrates 45

n the Fall of 1971, a young man named Phil Acord came to the campus of the Children's Home to interview for the position of Assistant Director. He had spent several years working as a probation officer through the juvenile court system, but was looking for a career that would allow him to make a difference in the lives of young children, to help prevent them from becoming part of the "system". He immediately knew on his first day, November 11th, that this was the place for him.

Fast forward 45 years, and Mr. Phil is continuing to lead this agency in its mission to prevent the dependency, neglect, abuse and delinguency of children by responding to the community's childcare needs. His leadership, experience, advocacy, and passion for the work he does, is an inspiration to his staff and our community at large. He has dedicated his life to his work and this agency, and his innovative spirit has made it what it is today, an institution revered for its success in Early Childhood Education and Childcare; as well as Residential Care.

And, even after four and a half decades, Phil continues to keep the agency moving forward. However, with all the great things we have accomplished, and current projects in the works, we still have more to do! The waiting list for our Early Childhood Education and Extended Childcare Program is nearing 550. That is an incredible number of children and families in our community in need of quality, accessible, affordable childcare. We continue to struggle with generating the funds we need to provide these services. When you provide quality services to low-income children, at a fee their families can afford, there is quite a gap between those fees and the costs. We also need more foster homes to care for the hundreds of children in this community who have been removed from their homes because of abuse, abandonment, and/or neglect. That means we continue to need your help!

Thank you in advance for whatever you are able to do to help the Chambliss Center for Children continue to care for the children in our community. May you have a Merry Christmas and a Blessed Holiday Season

We have a sensory room in our Residential Program that is used by the children when they need a safe, therapeutic, calming atmosphere. This helps them deal with trauma, relax, prevent outbursts, deal with crises, and become more self-aware.

A Search for PERMANENCY

In Hamilton and the surrounding counties, there are more than 800 children in state custody at any given time. These children have been removed from their homes because of abuse, abandonment, neglect, or they have come through the juvenile court system. Chambliss Center for Children contracts with the state to find loving, stable foster homes for these youth. Finding a permanent home for these children is the ultimate goal, whether with their biological parents - if the parents can complete the steps needed to regain custody of their children - or with other family members.

However, approximately 20% of these youth end up becoming available for adoption. These children are in need of permanent, lifelong connections.

We are currently trying to find an adoptive home for a sibling group of three who are now in the care of one of our foster homes. Stephanie, Dewayne and Rebecca, ages 14, 12 and 9 respectively, have come from a very traumatic situation, so our goal is to find an adoptive family that can support their educational growth and provide the individual attention each child needs.



We are continuing to open more ECE classrooms in Hamilton County Schools to serve the children of teachers, and we are looking forward to continuing to work with the W.K. Kellogg Foundation to better serve low-income families in our community.
