

CORNERSTONE TIME CAPSULE

This fall, we celebrated our 150th Anniversary with a special time capsule opening ceremony shared with our Board, Sustaining Board, and longtime agency friends. The time capsule was placed in the cornerstone on December 7, 1937, during the construction of the building. This was only the second time it has been opened since then! Inside we found multiple newspapers from significant days in the agency's history -- some dating back to the 1920s -- a guest book from the first Time Capsule Opening ceremony in 1978; a topographical map of the 17-acre campus; an agency brochure from the 100th Anniversary; and pictures of children from the Vine Street Orphans Home. We want to thank all who came out to share this special occasion with us, and we look forward to contributing to the time capsule for the next generation to open!
