# A Letter from Mr. Phil

Recently, my Facebook account posted a picture under "your memories" of a photo that I had shared a few years ago. It was the dedication of our new playground back in 1979. The picture showed Mrs. Joanne Hudlow, Mrs. Alice Stout, and me sitting on our newly created rock pile with about 15-20 children waving in the background. I shared the photo, as did a couple of friends, and we heard back from several of the children in the picture. They recognized themselves as well as many of their friends they had not seen in over 35 years. Most of the children in the photo are now in their late 40s or early 50s!



Last week at Sam's Club, a young man came up to me and asked, "Are you Mr. Phil?" It is almost impossible for me to go anywhere in Chattanooga without running into someone who has some connection to Chambliss Center for Children. I guess that is inevitable when you are associated with an organization that has been serving the community for 148 years, and you have been at that agency for 48 of those years!

As I think of the phenomena of being known as "Mr. Phil" everywhere I go, the word that comes to mind is **family.** When children and youth that we have provided services to are asked to describe what the program meant to them, they almost always say that we are like family. That response comes from children, parents, and other caregivers in both the early education and residential programs.

During the seasons of Thanksgiving, Christmas, and end of the year celebrations, most everyone is focused on getting together with their family. Chambliss Center for Children's focus is supporting family connections and activities.

Sometimes that means we are providing child care so a parent can work or go to school. Sometimes that means providing foster care while a family goes through treatment, or finds a job and a place to live. Sometimes that means finding an adoptive home for a child, because their biological family can't take care of them. Sometimes that means giving a young adult a place to live and support services while they transition into independence.

Every day, Chambliss Center for Children cares for almost eight hundred children throughout the community. The building blocks of every community are its families - strong families produce a strong community. When you support the Chambliss Center for Children, you help us help families become stronger, and that makes Chattanooga a better place for a child to grow up and thrive!

# SPECIAL PROJECTS UPDATE

We are continuing to expand our Transitional Living program. This program is designed to assist youth "aging out" of the foster care system. We provide housing, counseling, and training in basic life skills. We currently have 10 young adults in the program, and are finishing up a six-unit apartment building to serve even more. We are partnering with another local nonprofit, Homes & Havens, to design and furnish the interiors of our new units. They will help us provide peaceful, beautiful spaces using therapeutic "trauma-informed" design, creating personalized, tranquil interior designs that are free of stress-triggers. Thanks to a generous donor, Homes & Havens recently re-designed the office space of Jon Berestecky, our Transitional Living Specialist. He now has a calming, cool space to hang out with the young adults he works with in our program.




